Counselor's Corner

Dear Families,

As we approach the holiday season, we understand that this time of joy and celebration may bring mixed emotions for families who have experienced the loss of a loved one. Coping with grief, especially during the holidays, can be particularly challenging for children. In this special edition of our newsletter, we want to provide support and resources to help children navigate these emotions and find ways to remember and honor their loved ones during this festive time.

1. Acknowledge and Validate Feelings

It's essential to create a safe space for children to express their emotions. Let them know that it's okay to feel a range of emotions, from sadness to anger, and reassure them that their feelings are valid.

2. Create New Traditions
